



It is our goal that everyone who participates in an NATP event feels welcomed, safe and accepted. The Code of Conduct below outlines our event expectations.

NATP Event Code of Conduct

It is the policy of the National Association of Tax Professionals (NATP) that all participants, including attendees, vendors, NATP staff, volunteers and all other stakeholders at NATP events will conduct themselves in a professional manner that is welcoming to all participants and free from any form of discrimination, harassment or retaliation. Participants will treat each other with respect and consideration to create a pleasant, inclusive and professional environment at all NATP meetings, events or gatherings of any kind.

Participants will avoid any inappropriate actions or statements based on individual characteristics such as age, race, color, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, marital status, parental status, nationality, political affiliation, ability status, educational background or any other characteristic protected by law. Disruptive or harassing behavior of any kind will not be tolerated. Harassment includes, but is not limited to, inappropriate or intimidating behavior and language, unwelcomed jokes or comments, unwanted touching or attention, offensive images, photography without permission and stalking.

Sanctions for violating this Code of Conduct may range from verbal warning to ejection from the event without refund, or, if necessary, notifying appropriate authorities. Retaliation for complaints of inappropriate conduct will not be tolerated. If a participant observes inappropriate comments or actions, and personal intervention seems appropriate and safe, they should be considerate of all parties before intervening.
